RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All animals and articles must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor except as otherwise required by the prize list, and product of the said must have been grown during the current year.
- 2. Membership fee shall be \$3.00, and all exhibitors must be a member.
- 3. All exhibitors must pay admission to the Fair Grounds. The Society will pay 100% of prize money if at all possible, but will guarantee only that percentage found possible after the Fair.
- 4. Any person shall exhibit only one entry in each section unless otherwise specified. No restrictions in the horse division.
- 5. Any person or persons who shall interfere with the judges while in discharge of their duties, so shall use contemptuous or abusive language within their hearing shall be ejected, and, if an exhibitor, may forfeit any premiums he or she may win, and be debarred from exhibiting for one year thereafter.
- 6. The judges are expected to discuss any points that arise in connections with awards compatible with the time at their disposal.
- 7. No exhibit will necessarily be awarded a prize unless deemed worthy by the judge.
- 8. Entries for horse classes will close 9:00 pm Thursday prior to the Fair.
- 9. * All animals must be in place no later than 9:30 am the day of the Fair, and may not be removed before 4:00 pm without permission of the committee in charge.
- 10. All animals must be secured in such a way as to fully protect the public. Exhibits of cattle and/or horses, except calves and colts, must be shown on halter.
- 11. Exhibitors of registered stock must present registration papers to the secretary when entering and when requested to do so, except for animals under one year when pedigrees of dam will be accepted.

12. The society will as far as possible take care of articles on exhibit, but will not be responsible for any loss, nor returning any articles by mail.

- 13. Protests affecting awards must be made in writing to the Secretary before 8:00 pm on the day of the Fair accompanied by a \$20.00 deposit, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest is not sustained by a majority of the Directors in a meeting.
- 14. All animals and articles are at the command of the committee in charge while on the grounds.

- 15. All judges will be appointed by the committee in charge.
- 16. No person may act as a judge in a department where he or she is an exhibitor.
- 17. All Arts and Hobby Craft, Plants and Flowers, Field and Garden, Baking exhibits will be judged the day before the Fair and must be in place by 11:00 am on the Friday before Fair day.
- 18. Exhibits may be removed any time after 4:00 pm Fair Day.
- 19. All trophies will be awarded at the Agricultural Society Annual Meeting in November.

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



Membership Fee of \$3.00 must be paid. Entry Fees are Non-refundable.

PLEASE NOTE: NO STALLIONS WILL BE ALLOWED IN JUNIOR CLASSES. SAFETY HELMETS MUST BE WORN BY JUNIOR RIDERS IN ALL CLASSES AND GYMKHANA.

A junior is any exhibitor who has not celebrated his/her 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current year. The following age groups will apply unless otherwise specified:

Junior A: 15 - 17 yrs. of age Junior B: 12 - 14 yrs. of age Junior C: 11 yrs. of age and under A senior rider is 18 years of age and older.

Entries are to be sent to Noelle Bonk before 9pm on July 21, 2022. However, you can enter the day of the show but it is preferred if you do so in advance. Entry fees will be \$2 per class. Gymkhana entry fees are \$1 per class. Each exhibitor must pay a \$3 membership fee. These fees must be paid on or before the day of the fair. All competitors are asked to sign a waiver form. Regulations:

- > Fruits and vegetables will be judges by form, size, colour, quality and freedom
- from blemishes
- > Beets and carrots roots intact, top removed 1/2 inch above crown
- Onions roots removed 1/2 inch below the bulb, tops are to be removed 3 inches from bulb
- Cabbage and Lettuce roots removed close to head
- Beans and peas stem and calyx attached
- Vegetable display of 6 should be trimmed as they would be if they were each in their own class
- Rhubarb leaf 1 inch in a fan shape, stalk left attached as pulled from the plant
- Strawberries and raspberries approximately 1/2 to 1 inch of stem attached
- Apples stem intact and uniformly trimmed
