EASTSIDE HERITAGE HORSE SHOW
HORSE SHOW & SAFETY RULES

1. Neither the Twin Valley Riding Club nor the Eastside Heritage Show Committee nor any of its officials shall be responsible for the loss or injury from whatsoever cause to exhibitor, person, property, although care will be taken to prevent such loss or injury. **A release form must be signed before competing.**
2. **Early Entries are appreciated by Thursday, July 1st, 2021**, but entries will be accepted the day of the show. **Early Entries will be entered in a Secretary Appreciation Raffle for a prize drawn on Show Day.** No fees will be refunded unless horse or rider is a medical out.
3. Eastside Heritage Horseshow will follow **Covid 19 Public Health Orders** and the applicable guidelines in the Re Open Saskatchewan Plan.
 - a. Physical distancing guidelines and sanitation procedures as per Saskatchewan Health will be in effect to ensure the safest possible environment for everyone involved.
 - b. We will be following the applicable guidelines “Racing, Livestock Sales and Rodeo” (<https://www.saskatchewan.ca/government/health-care-administration-and-provider-resources/treatment-procedures-and-guidelines/emerging-public-health-issues/2019-novel-coronavirus/re-open-saskatchewan-plan/guidelines/racing--livestock-sales-and-rodeo-guidelines>)
4. Saskatchewan Horse Federation rules apply for all Heritage Classes. Exhibitors are requested to read carefully all rules governing this show. Competition rules will follow the SHF Rule book. All Judge decisions are final.
5. Heritage Classes are not limited to SHF members, however, to accumulate points for circuit awards, an exhibitor must be a current member of the SHF and provide proof of membership with the entry form.
6. Western equipment and attire are required for Western classes (hat/helmet, western shirt, pants, boots).
7. English equipment and attire are required for English classes (helmet, English style jacket, pants, boots).
8. Stallions are to be handled only by adults.
9. Youth Exhibitor Age Divisions are:
 - a. Pee Wee (8 & under), Junior C (9-11), Junior B (12-14) and Junior A (15-17).
 - b. Ages are as of January 1st of the current year.
 - c. Some classes will be combined to show but will be placed separately.
10. Junior Horses are 5 years and under.
11. Senior Horses are 6 years and over and must be shown in a full bridle and one-handed (except for exhibitors - 11 years and under and novice adults).
12. Exhibitors are responsible to be on time for each class and must notify Ring Steward of a tack change.

13. The Show Committee reserves the right to split, combine, or cancel classes as entries warrant.
14. The **Walk Trot class is open to beginner exhibitors of any age** who may not yet be confident to lope/canter in a show ring setting,
 - a. the exhibitor may not show in any other riding classes except gymkhana events
 - b. the exhibitor may lope in the gymkhana events given entries ride one at a time.
15. The **Begin to Show class is open to beginner exhibitors of any age** who are beginning to show and/or have never won a red (1st place) ribbon.
16. If entered in the Leadline class,
 - a. the exhibitor may not show in any other riding classes except gymkhana events
 - b. the exhibitor may only be led by someone 18 years of age or older (as of Jan. 1st of current year).
17. **All youth under the age of 18 years (as of Jan. 1st of current year) are required to wear an approved ASTM/SEI helmet when participating in any event sanctioned by the SHF at all times when mounted, driving or riding in a horse drawn vehicle or handling a horse.**
18. Horses are not to be left unattended in the ring for any reason.
19. The Judge may send any entry from the ring for bad behavior. Any form of animal cruelty, anywhere on the grounds, will not be tolerated.
20. All classes requiring a pattern will have the appropriate pattern posted prior to class.
21. No person other than the Judge, show committee, and Ring Steward shall be allowed in the show ring.
22. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibitor, animal, stand, or trailer that may be falsely entered or may be deemed unsuitable, objectionable, without assigning any reason therefore, and the Show Committee shall be exonerated from any claim, whatsoever, on the part of the exhibitor or purchaser, for such removal.
23. Any person who shall attempt to interfere with the Judge while discharging his/her duties, or refuses to accept the Judge's award, or at any time while on the premises of the Exhibition grounds use contemptuous or abusive language shall be rejected. If an exhibitor, he/she shall forfeit the right to any premium to which he/she might otherwise be entitled and may be excluded from exhibiting.
24. Exhibitors shall submit to the requirements of the Judge. Otherwise, their entries will be disqualified, and his/her entry fees shall be forfeited.
25. Medical and Emergency protocols are in place for the Eastside Heritage Horse Show. Each competitor receives a prize list, copy of rules/safety guidelines and emergency info with contact list in their Exhibitor bags received at time of entry check in. A 1st Responder will be onsite.
26. An Injured Animal Plan is in place for the Eastside Heritage Horse Show and an on-call vet contact number will be available.
