2019 was year-one of the Three-year Strategic Plan with progress made on many SHF programs. To highlight just a few, SHF, Western College of Veterinary Medicine and Prairieland Park partnered in February for the 8th year to present Equine Expo. In October the Long Term Equestrian Development plan (LTED)was updated giving us renewed focus. In November a highly supported two-day Coaches Symposium was held in Moose Jaw.

In September the SHF was excited to launch the Saskatchewan Horse Federation Hall of Fame to celebrate horse owners, breeders, athletes and horses for their impact on the province's development. The inaugural installation of the 2019 Inductees will take place as part of the 2020 Annual General Meeting March 14th. Find more about the new initiative on the April pages.

This year the SHF is again pleased to present the 2019 Annual Report in a calendar format. We hope you enjoy reading and using it. Thanks very much to everyone for submitting photos for consideration in the report. Annual Report – Long-Term Equestrian Development February 2020

The Saskatchewan Horse Federation recognizes **five** development pathways that work together for a 'made in Saskatchewan' version of the LTED model. Coaches, Officials, Athletes, Competitions and Horses that will carry forward as the five focus areas for 2020. Objectives for each pillar will work within the LTAD and LTED framework as established by Sport Canada and Equestrian Canada to provide a development pathway that is tailored to the needs of our Saskatchewan riders.

The 'go forward' plan includes all riders, at all levels – regardless of discipline.

Coaches- The SHF recognizes all individuals who instruct or train a rider as someone who is engaged in the activity of 'coaching', and will encourage all to become part of the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP). We will promote the 'Respect in Sport' module, coach development, coach licencing, and certification for those advancing to speciality and high-performance instruction.

Officials – The SHF recognizes all administrators, instructors, and certified officials as part of the officials' development stream. These people develop and/or enforce rules for barn, trail, arena or competition ring that ensure safety, fair play and equine welfare.

Athlete – The term 'athlete' refers to anyone who rides, drives or vaults, and is not just a label that applies to someone in the competition stream. It includes riders at all stages and in any discipline.

Competitions – The SHF recognizes that each person has different goals and acknowledges competition pathways that encompass everything from 'personal best' to podium performance.

Horses – This pillar recognizes the need for appropriate mounts for riders at all levels and committee recommendations include partnering with the Industry Committee to promote the development of equine athletes.

2019 SHF Member Outreach Committee Report, Chair Jason Hanley

The Heritage Circuit was developed in the early 80's as a grassroots learning program and grew from there into the Horse Show circuit we know today. The "Sport for All" concept helps to raise awareness of horse sport in Saskatchewan and provides a pathway for athletes to participate in Heritage Circuit Provincial Finals, Sask Summer Games, Prairie Cup Series, NRHA, Breed Shows, etc., and encourages participation in Long Term Equestrian Development.

2019 saw 233 Heritage Circuit nominated horse/rider pairs competing at 56 competitions around the province. Including Prairie Cup Series competitions there were 63 shows in total, and 16 of them were sanctioned with Equestrian Canada.

Each year SHF members are asked to submit suggestions for Heritage Circuit & Prairie Cup Series rule changes. Discipline reps, officials, and the committee reviewed all submissions and the Official version of the updated 2020 Handbook is available at www.saskhorse.ca. If you would like a print copy of the Handbook please contact the SHF office.



- The SHF wants to hear from the young equestrians on what could be done to help them achieve their goals in the Equine Sport. What the youth would like to see in the future of their industry.



2019 SHF Industry Committee Report, Chair Jason Hanley

In 2019 the Industry Committee worked with legal counsel developing the first of a series of general contracts for member use. In discussion with Livestock Services Saskatchewan (LSS) it was determined that some of the more challenging equine issues that horse owners deal with and that LSS is called to address relate to the sale of horse.

Often this is the result of not using contracts or use of incomplete contracts relative to sale of horses, working with agents and pre-purchase exams. Two contracts have received final review and appear on the SHF website under the Industry tab. More work will be done in this area during the 2020 budget cycle. Annual Report - Equine Health and Welfare February 2020

The Saskatchewan Horse
Federation plays an important
role in ensuring the humane
and ethical use of horses in
sport and competition. It is the
duty of the Equine Health and
Welfare Committee to keep
the SHF Board of Directors
and our members informed on
all matters related to Equine
Health and Welfare. This
includes the dissemination
of information and support

of Provincial and Federal regulations that affect the management of or pose threats to the provincial herd.

As a Provincial Sport Governing Body (PSGB), we are responsible to support the rules set by Equestrian Canada (EC) to ensure that the provincial competitions under our jurisdiction align with both medications control and rules of play that ensure the ethical use of horses in competition. Members of the Equine Health and Welfare Committee maintain a close working relationship with the Western College of Veterinary Medicine (WCVM) and Veterinary Teaching Hospital (VTH) to provide educational opportunities for horse owners. Events such as the Saskatchewan Equine Expo provide people with information on herd health, biosecurity, nutrition, lameness and a host of other topics.

The Committee also works with regulatory bodies to ensure that we have the most recent information regarding diseases that threaten Saskatchewan horses.

The efforts the Federation, with member support, will ensure that strategies are implemented that mitigate the risk of harm to our equine partners and ensure the future of our sport.

Prairie Cup Series Year End Report - 2019

The Prairie Cup Series was developed in 2009 as a pathway for athletes to transition from the Heritage Circuit into higher levels of competition and Championship events, in Saskatchewan, Canada, and Internationally. By promoting Prairie Cup Series disciplines of Dressage, Hunter, Jumper, and Reining, we also raise public awareness of High Performance athletes and events in Saskatchewan.

In 2019 there were 104 Prairie Cup Series nominated horse/rider pairs competing at

26 competitions. Including Heritage Circuit competitions there were 63 shows in total, and 16 of them were sanctioned with Equestrian Canada.

The SHF Coaching Committee achieved some outstanding results in 2019. I would like to thank the committee for all their hard work.

2019 Accomplishments:

- Info sessions (Coaching, Judging & Learn to Rider Programs) were held at the AGM in March, Equine Expo in February and Pet Expo in May.
- Two Learn to Ride financial incentives in the amount of \$500 each. were given to the coach who administered

the most rider level exams (combined English and Western) and the Facility that hosted the most rider level exams. This incentive will be offered in 2020 as well.

- Two successful Western Instructor Evaluations were held on February 24, 2019.
- The number of current certified Saskatchewan coaches keeps gradually increasing as certified coaches commit to updating their coaching records
- Appreciation tumblers were distributed to all current certified

coaches during National Coaches Week Sept. 21-29.

The SHF Coaching Symposium
was held on November 9th and 10th,
2019 at the Moose Jaw Exhibition
Grounds. The Symposium was geared
towards our instructors, coaches,
trainers and industry professionals, and
offered a wide variety of professional
development opportunities, ranging
from equine health, athlete health,
business practices and coaching
techniques.

Coach Licencing - Equestrian Canada (EC) Board of Directors unanimously approved the Coach Licencing Program with a vision that every coach is licenced and certified by 2025.
